**INTENTIONS OF HIS HOLINESS,  
POPE FRANCIS I FOR OCTOBER**

**Pope’s Universal Intention:** *Workers and the Unemployed.* That all workers may receive respect and protection of their rights, and that the unemployed may receive the opportunity to contribute to the common good.

**Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**

The Catholic Church professes and teaches that the anointing of the sick is one of the seven sacraments of the New Testament, that it was instituted by Christ our Lord, “intimated in Mark (6:13) and through James, the apostle and brother of the Lord, recommended to the faithful and made known: ‘Is there anyone sick among you? Let him send for the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick man and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, they will be forgiven him’ (James 5:14-15).”

Vatican Council II adds the following: “ ‘Extreme unction,’ which may also and more properly be called ‘anointing of the sick,’ is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived.’ ”

“The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers from being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person’s condition becomes more serious.”

“A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.”

Elderly people may be anointed if they become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present.”
