ST. JAMES ADULT CHOIR: The Saint James Adult Choir is comprised of parishioners ranging in age from their late teens to their retirement years. The Adult Choir sings at the 9:30 AM Mass every Sunday and at a variety of other services (including Holy Days of Obligation) through the year. The Adult Choir normally meets in church for practice on Wednesday night at 7 PM. No specific level of skill is required for entry. We will work with you to develop the skills you need.

ST. JAMES FOLK CHOIR: The Saint James Folk Choir serves in music ministry for the 10:45 am Sunday Mass each week, as well as First Communion and other CCD/Religious Education events, with rehearsals on Tuesdays at 7:30PM. We seek members who enjoy singing and playing liturgical music as a group. No specific level of skill is required for entry. We will work with you to develop the skills you need.

SONG LEADERS: Song Leaders (or "Cantors") are volunteers selected by the Directors of Music, who promote greater congregational participation by leading the assembly in song at Mass. A Song-Leader website is available to help familiarize them with each week's music. Song Leader rehearsals are held as-needed, every month or two.
